The Purpose:

The purpose of the CCHS Impact Term (I-Term) is to enhance student learning by providing additional spiritual, academic, personal, and leadership experiences outside the traditional classroom in conjunction with the CCS Curricular Program.

The Principles:

- Knowing their purpose before God, students must discover how God has designed them with

unique giftedness and a specific calling. (Purpose before God)

- Knowing their purpose before God, students must pursue areas of personal interest and abilities to develop their God-given talents, leadership qualities, and creative skills. (Academic Student Outcomes)

- Achieving educational excellence demands purposeful and strategic pursuit of our God-given

purpose in every aspect of the educational process. (Purpose, Key Value: Excellence)

- Acquiring knowledge, understanding and wisdom means application of God's truth to every aspect of life through a deliberate instructional discipline process. (Purpose)

The I-Term school day:

The day begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 2:45 p.m. Some classes may be academic in nature with homework and class preparation required outside of class. Other classes may be practical in nature and involve hands-on participation. Students must check course descriptions carefully to be familiar with individual class expectations.

Grading for I-Term is as follows:

Each course will receive one half of a semester credit (.5). As a graduation requirement, each student is required to earn one half I-Term credit per year. I-Term credits are in addition to, not in place of, other graduation requirements.

In addition to meeting the instructor's criteria for passing the class, students must attend all classes during the week to receive credit for the course. I Term is MANDATORY, students must complete this course in order to meet graduation requirements. Running start students that have administrative approval to not attend one of the established I-Term courses will need to select an I-Term group to be a part of and attend the 4 required training sessions. They will then need to complete the 26 hours of missed on-site time in a CCS approved program (i.e., summer camp, elementary aftercare, etc.).

Registration:

Registration for I-Term will be on a first come, first served basis. Please note that ALL SEN-IORS will be given priority for selection of classes if their form is turned in On Monday, October 31, 2016 by 8:00 am. All students are expected to select three preferences in case classes are full. Registration forms are due by November 16, 2016 at 3:30 p.m., to be given prioritized consideration. Please feel free to call the school office with questions (253) 445-9706 between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Training Sessions:

Students will meet with their instructors for training sessions in preparation for the I Term week. Training sessions will include developing a Maximum Impact Statement, developing a project outline, completing group assignments, making community contacts, coordinating a time line, and moving as a team toward implementing the goals of the course. Training days will oc cur during flex time and half days. Students are required to attend all the training sessions.

Class Fees:

The class fees that are assessed are to cover cost of supplies, materials or transportation for each project. Students must provide their own lunches daily, unless instructed otherwise.

I-Term Course Descriptions

Zoo Crew Jill Patrick	In this course students will learn about the animals, their habitats and conservation programs supported by Woodland Park Zoo. Over the course of this year students will interact with 3rd grade students at the Puyallup Elementary School sharing their knowledge and preparing the students for a field trip to Woodland Park Zoo, where the CCS students will be the tour guides as we explore the zoo together. In addition to learning about conservation programs and zoo tours, the students in this class will conduct a service project at the Woodland Park Zoo during the IMPACT term week in April. Cost per student: \$100-130. Covers field trips and transportation Students on this team will be working at the South Seattle Dream Center to reach and assist struggling families in the South Seattle area. This team will go out into		
South Sound Dream Center Alyssa and Drew Minaker	South Seattle suburbs to reach out to those in need. Just as in inner cities, the suburbs are full of ruined and destroyed lives. Each student will be able to put their gifting and talent to use through the many and varied outreaches. Expect God to use each member in unbelievable ways. Cost per student: \$70.00 Covers supplies and transportation		
Animal Rescue Lacy Sorn	Students will be working with local animal shelters assisting in all areas, from cleaning up animal environments, to preparing animals for adoption. Students in this class will call and coordinate volunteers, organize conservation clean-up, do research and assisting shelters to meet the needs of the community. Cost per student: \$70.00 Students must be 15 years old		
CCS At Large Jacob LeFrancois	Students will be given the opportunity to serve on our very own campus. Projects will be developed based upon the needs of the campus coordinator. Cleaning, painting, and sprucing up our campus, as well as completing some projects at the district office campus will be the order of business. Cost per student: \$20.00 Covers supplies		
The Father's Ranch Tonasket, WA Kelli Findlay	This I term opportunity will take place at "The Father's Ranch" Omak WA. The ranch is an organization that works with women and teenage girls who are wounded and hurting, and are in the process of healing after confronting some of life's most difficult situations. The plan is to join in God's work at the ranch during I Term week, and lend a helping hand wherever they can. It is sure to be an eye-opening and life-changing experience, for anyone who has a heart for coming alongside the hurting heart to see healing. See the website for more details about the ranch. I-Term Course Descriptions

Elementary Tutoring Bryan Peterson	This class will provide students with the opportunity to make a difference in the life of CCS elementary students by tutoring in classrooms. Students may also provide general assistance to teachers and may have the opportunity to teach a portion of a class. Cost per student: \$25.00 Covers supplies, lunch and snacks		
It's a Small World After All Darlene Kasper	Mrs. Kasper is looking for 5 key CCS ambassadors with a passion for working with International students arriving to our campus in February. This experience will include a cultural emersion for our friends from China and Japan. University of Washington, Pike Place Market, Space Needle, Seattle Big Wheel, and other opportunities to learn about our great community may be included. Cost per student: \$100.00 (Interested students must be approved by Mrs. Kasper prior to registration).		
Habitat for Humanity Pasco, WA Kali McCrady	The work: (from HfH siteJ Pull together your friends, your family, your co-workers and have fun making a difference. Volunteer groups are a critical piece of our new home construction, as well as our home repair projects. We welcome all types of groups – corporate, faith-based, non-profit, education, civic and community groups. (That's us!) The community: Pasco (and great Tri-Cities area) has a very different demographic of people and incomes than our I-5 corridor. We would be serving a community that has double in size in the last 20 years, but also has 50% of people below the poverty line. The fun: Multinomah Falls, Maryhill Museum, The Reach Museum, maybe visiting the Hanford Reservation, The confluence of the Yakima, Snake, and Columbia Rivers, and other explorations! Cost per student: \$300-400; 15 participants, must be 16+ years old by I-Term		
Hope for the Homeless Cathy Miller	Puyallup has homeless people who are most in need of help during the cold, winter nights of the year. This I-Term will join with a local church to provide services for the homeless during these months. As a team, we will volunteer 3 hours a night every other week during the months of January through March with one additional follow-up visit during I-Term week. The service will involve preparing and serving meals, setting up cots, handing out clothing, providing fellowship and any other needs that might become apparent during the time you work. The cost for the I-Term is \$100, which includes a sweatshirt and food donations to the Freezing Nights Program. The I-Term is limited to 15 participants, so pray if this service fits who you are and sign up if you feel the draw!		
Sports Camp Chelsea Spaniel	Do you love sports!? Do you enjoy ministering to young kids? Then participating in a sports camp is the perfect I-term for you. Be a light for God through sports, and youth outreach by teaming up and serving CCS Puyallup Elementary. Every day we will meet around 12:00, pray, pick activities, and head over to Puyallup elementary to serve their extended care kiddos. By teaching them sportsmanship, healthy living and how to build sports skills, we will minister to kids what it means to be on "God's team" and how we can be good sports in our faith! Serve God, serve your community and have fun while you do it! Cost per student: \$25, includes t-shirt and snacks		

I-Term Course Descriptions

Sound Impact Erik Eklund

"Sound Impact" is an opportunity to serve with two local organizations, Reformed University Fellowship (RUF) at The University of Washington (Seattle) and CareNet Pregnancy Resource Centers of Puget Sound. RUF is an evangelical ministry whose purpose is to preach the gospel and create a fellowship of Christians at The University of Washington (Seattle). CareNet is dedicated to providing ultrasounds, clothing, and other needed materials for mothers who find themselves in crisis pregnancies, as well as providing information so that mothers might choose life over abortion. As an I-Term, our goal is to help grow awareness of these two ministries at our school through our partnership, serve the ministry workers themselves, and learn about how we can become more involved in the success of these ministries after high school.

Sambica Retreat Kendra Jennings

Do you love summer camps? I do! I love getting away and spending time connecting with youth and God. Sambica is an I-Term that will allow us to give a helping hand at the campground and have a taste of the camp experience at night. Sambica is a summer campground and a retreat center located by Lake Sammamish. We will be staying on the campground and getting to know each other through service projects, dining together, playing games, messages and having cabin times. The service projects in the past have been painting, demolition, pressure washing, etc. We will be told the specific jobs of the week when we arrive at the camp. Cost per student: \$275, covers supplies, accommodations, and food. Max students: 18

Delano Bay Mike Farnsworth

Delano Bay Christian Camp is a beautiful center for Christian activity located on the Puget Sound near Penn Rose State Park, about a one hour drive from Tacoma. In the summer, the sights and sounds of young people enjoying Delano Bay Christian Youth Camps tell a wonderful story. A dining hall full of exuberant youngsters at mealtime; Bible classes on a grassy hillside, under trees and on cabin porches; fierce competition in a game of capture the flag; the blending of voices in praise around a campfire; the serenity of watching the rising moon reflected in the bay. These are among the ingredients which give the camp its life-enriching impact on youth. This I-term offers students a chance to help the camp get ready for the camping season. We will tackle painting, construction and other crucial jobs that will help prepare the camp. On the last day we plan on Kayaking over to Penn Rose State Park.
