Noon–2:00 p.m.	Pray for the Church and Missionaries	PRAY FOR THE GREAT COMMISSION Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age. —Matthew 28:19–20 (NIV)
2:00–3:00 p.m.	Pray for Vocation and Businesses	PRAY FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS AND SERVING THE LORD Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving. —Colossians 3:23–24 (NIV)
5:00–7:00 p.m.	Pray for Family and Community	PRAY FOR UNITY AND LOVE Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. —Romans 12:9–10 (NIV)
